We wish everyone a peaceful and safe festive season and look forward to 2022, no matter what challenges it may or may not bring.



We were also particularly pleased to be awarded the Primary Science Quality Mark at Monk Fryston this term. This recognises the high profile that the subject has within the school, and takes into account a number of initiatives that have been led by our science leader, Mrs Walsh. The assessor commented: "Thank you for sharing your PSQM year with me. It has been a pleasure to witness the passion and enthusiasm you have for science. The science subject leader

should be commended on the dedication they have given to improving the teaching and learning of science at Monk Fryston C of E Primary School. The children are very lucky to go to a school with such enthusiastic and committed staff. Well done on a great submission!"

This beautifully reflects the important part science plays in our school curriculum and we are delighted that this has been formally recognised. This year, we are working with the Royal Society this year on a project relating to important animals.



What a super term, it has been wonderful to return to a little normality, and where possible, safe to have some whole school events! It has been brilliant to reinstate our children's leadership roles across school. This term we have seen the return of our Junior Leadership Team, House Captains, Shine Leaders, Office Angels and Heroes, along with our very popular Year 6 buddying systems.

We started the term with an enterprise theme, where all classes were given £50 to produce a well-being themed item to sell at our 'welcome back fair' at the end of September. It was amazing to welcome back our families to the school site for this event. The children and staff worked incredibly hard to prepare their goods and stalls. The children were excellent sales people; they worked their magic on the customers and raised £590. Our Junior Leadership Team used the money to plan a whole school treat, which included a visit from Ian's mobile farm, pizza for lunch and sweets to finish the week off. The PTA went the extra mile to make the event a success by working hard to plan and organise a whole host of activities and stalls.

At the end of September, our Year 6 pupils went on their residential visit to Kingswood in the Dearne Valley. They spent their time challenging themselves to fly down the zip wire, learn new games such as aeroball, develop their navigational skills and have fun in the kayaks.

As wellbeing is a focus at SMPS, we ended our first half term with a whole school Thrive Day. All the children spent the day working

working together in their house teams, completing a variety of activities, such as being outdoors on a nature hunt, yoga and arts and crafts, fully embracing everything that was on offer. We explored the reasons why each activity was important and understood how it can help us with our emotions.

For Anti-Bullying Week, we focused on ways that we can interact with one another in positive ways. We celebrated the things that make us unique and tried to be kind to everyone. Key Stage Two enjoyed a 'One Kind Word' workshop, where they played games to explore different types of bullying and ways to confidently speak up for themselves. Every class learnt about being different and ways to celebrate individuality in PSHE over the course of the week.

Year 6 were incredibly lucky: they were visited by 92-year-old Trude, a Holocaust survivor, who talked about her incredible journey from Czechoslovakia to England when she was only ten years old. She shared details about life in Europe in the 1930s, what it was like to flee to Newcastle, only able to speak Slovak and German, and how she eventually managed to make a new life for herself. The children were incredibly respectful and listened carefully to everything she had to say.

We are ending another tricky term with lots of festive treats and celebrations. We have Christmas light switch-ons, carol concerts and productions, a whole school trip to the panto and a visit from the big man himself all planned to ensure SMPS shines during the festive period.

Everyone at Kirk Fenton would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas.




