



HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME POLICY

1. Principles of the Policy

The Trust's policy, in line with Government guidelines, is that parents should not take their children out of school during term time.

Parents should not expect their child's school to agree to an absence for a holiday, or indeed for any other reason, during term time unless exceptional circumstances have been established and agreed upon.

2. Definitions

Term time – The days that a school is in session as defined by its school calendar.

3. Aims

We are committed to giving every child within the STAR MAT the best education they can have and the very first step of this is keeping student attendance as high as possible. This policy supports this commitment.

4. Applying Exceptional Circumstances

Exceptional circumstances could include (evidence would be required in each case):

- Service personnel returning from a tour of duty abroad where it is evidenced that the individual would not be in receipt of any leave in the near future that coincides with school holidays.
- Where an absence from school is recommended by a health professional as part of a parent or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue.
- The death or terminal illness of a close family member.
- To attend the wedding or funeral of a close family member
- Other out of the ordinary or life changing events that affect the individual pupil in question or a close family member (such events to be decided upon at the discretion of the headteacher and/or the STAR MAT CEO)

If a request meets the above exceptional circumstances but falls within the following times, the Headteacher must be convinced that absence from school is the only option:

- The first half term of any academic year (applies to all pupils).
- Options time (applicable to secondary school pupils).

- At any time during an exam period (an exam period will be defined by the headteacher and will not be subject to interpretation).
- At any other time specified by an individual school.

5. Roles and Responsibilities of Staff

Where it is not clear that a request outlines exceptional circumstance then the headteacher may consult with the STAR MAT CEO. In such circumstances, the CEO's decision is final.

Decisions relating to possible sanctions for unauthorised absence, including instruction to the Local Authority to issue a fine (or fines) are at the discretion of a school's headteacher, as per formal guidance. The Headteacher may wish to consult with governors, Trustees and/or the STAR MAT CEO but the authority to pursue a sanction will remain with the headteacher. In addition, the Local Authority can, in certain circumstances, implement a range of sanctions. This is normally done in consultation with schools.
